 - 3. Then, in the midst of their despair, the LORD sent this message through Jahaziel: "... 15 'Do not be afraid and do not be dismayed at this great horde, for the battle is not yours but God's. 16 Tomorrow go down against them. Behold, they will come up by the ascent of Ziz. You will find them at the end of the valley, east of the wilderness of Jeruel. 17 You will not need to fight in this battle. Stand firm, hold your position, and see the salvation of the LORD on your behalf, O Judah and Jerusalem." That doesn't make sense!
 - a. What if God doesn't hold to His promise?
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 - c. Imagine Peter stepping out onto the water to walk on it! (Mt. 14:28-29)
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- 1. Since Joash, the new king, was only seven, and since Jehoiada was so instrumental in him becoming king, it seems that Jehoiada was somewhat reigning through Joash especially in his younger years.
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- "Now after the death of Jehoiada the princes of Judah [thus the sons of Joash] came and paid homage to the king. Then the king listened to them.
