# (<u>Aarise</u>) CONFESSION and ABSOLUTION / FORGIVENESS (TLH 48) (1 Jn. 1:8; Jn. 3:16; Mt. 5:16; Jn. 20:19–23):

- L: In the name of the Father and of the **†** Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- L: And now I ask you before God, who searches the heart: **(1)** *Do you sincerely confess that you have sinned against God and deserve His wrath and punishment?*

L: →Certainly, you should so believe, for Holy Scripture declares: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life."

(4) Do you intend that with the aid of the Holy Spirit you will, from this time forward, amend your sinful life?

# C: I do intend.

L: →Certainly, you should so intend, for Christ, the Lord, says: "Let you light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in

# heaven."


Finally, **(5)** do you believe that through me, a called servant of God, you will receive the forgiveness of all your sins?
