## Luke 2:40-52 ESV

## Wise Men Still Seek Him!

Sunday, January 3 at 8:00 & 10:45 + Monday, January 4 at 7 PM Second Sunday after Christmas – 2016

**Introduction**: Dear friends in Jesus Christ: There is *worldly wisdom* and there is *godly wisdom*.

- <u>The world might say to us</u>, "Life is short, so \*put yourself first, \*get rich quick, and \*enjoy life!"
- <u>God might say to us</u>, "Your existence is eternal here on earth and somewhere else forever and ever, so \*put me first, \*be content with what you have, and \*honor me with your life!"

So <u>who</u> has our ear – *the world or God*? The one to whom we are listening is the path we will follow.

- <u>The worldly path</u> seems right because \*most people are on it and \*the pleasures are immediate; furthermore, it's a good fit with our old nature.
- <u>The godly path</u> can seem *lonely and difficult*; however, we are encouraged to *get on it* **and** *remain on it* because of *•*the <u>present blessings</u> of peace and joy **and** *•*the <u>countless eternal blessings</u> in God's presence!

In today's text, from the end of Luke chapter 2, we will focus on the family of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus—when He was 12 years old. Let's learn from them and apply God's Word to our daily Christian lives.

 Jesus Was Growing Up: Luke summarized Jesus' first 12 years with these words: <sup>40</sup> And the child grew and became strong, [being] filled with wisdom. And the favor [the grace] of God was upon him. // So things are moving very quickly; less than two weeks ago we celebrated Jesus' birth, but now He has been circumcised and named (when He was eight days old), He was presented at the temple (when He was 40 days old),
He was visited by the wise men (when He was in Bethlehem), He was quickly taken to Egypt (to escape Herod's soldiers), and He settled in Nazareth with Joseph and Mary. From His conception to His present age, Jesus has been living without sin in our place!

- 2. Jesus' Parents Proceeded with Wisdom: <sup>41</sup> Now his parents went to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover. // Why was that wise? Because the LORD had commanded it (Deut. 16:16),<sup>1</sup> so, being faithful OT believers, they did it. The Bible says that the "fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; A good understanding have all those who do His commandments" (Psalm 111:10 NAS). Let us also be wise by understanding and living God's Word!
- Jesus' Parents May Have Been Doing without Much *Thinking*: <sup>42</sup> And when he was twelve years old, they went up according to [the] custom [ἔθος – "<u>law</u>" (used for Jewish laws in the LXX) TDNT, one volume, 202;] [of the feast]. <sup>43</sup> And when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. [And] His parents did not know it, <sup>44</sup> but supposing him to be in the group they went a day's journey, but

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The feasts of Passover and Unleavened Bread occurred back-to-back, with one flowing into the other; it's almost as if they are one, *even though they are two*. The LORD said to Moses: <sup>5</sup> "The LORD's Passover begins at twilight on the **fourteenth day** of the first month. <sup>6</sup> On the **fifteenth day** of that month the LORD's Feast of Unleavened Bread begins" (Lev 23:5-6 NIV).

then they began to search for him among their relatives and acquaintances, <sup>45</sup> and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, searching for him. // When I was in Burkina Faso (West Africa), it was common to see children without their parents – because everyone watched out for each other!

- a. Joseph and Mary were following the law: "Three times a year all your males shall appear before the LORD your God..." (Deut. 16:16 ESV). So their attendance at the feast may have been a custom, but it was also a law; remember, Jesus came to perfectly fulfill the law for everyone (Matt. 5:17). Joseph and Mary followed the law as faithful OT believers, but were they thinking about the purpose of the Passover Feast and who Jesus is the Ultimate Passover Lamb?
- b. What about <u>you and me</u>, can we go through the *right motions* without the right thinking? Yes, so the Lord calls us to <u>meditate on His Word</u>; then, to encourage us, He promises great blessings to those who do so (Joshua 1:8; Psalm 1:1-3)!
- 4. Jesus Was Learning: <sup>46</sup> After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. <sup>47</sup> And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding [insight] and his answers. // Did you notice how Jesus was learning: He was listening, thinking about what was said, and asking questions. You are also invited to listen and ask now and during our classes!
- 5. A Wake-Up Event for Jesus' Parents: <sup>48</sup> And when his parents saw him, they were astonished. And his

mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us so? Behold, [for three days] your father and I have been searching for you in great distress [pain, agony, anxiety]." <sup>49</sup> And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must [ $\delta \varepsilon \tilde{\iota}$ ] be in my Father's house [of the – affairs – of my Father]?" <sup>50</sup> And they did not understand the saying that he spoke to them. // Jesus was at the age to be trained in observing the festivals; such training took place in secondary schools – the best of which was located in Jerusalem. That seems to be the place where Jesus' was found. That reality must have flooded their minds with the prophecies that had been spoken about Him!

6. Moving Forward with Wisdom: <sup>51</sup> And he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was submissive to them. And his mother treasured up [carefully kept] all these things in her heart. <sup>52</sup> And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature [maturity, age] and in favor with God and man [men] [thus people]. // Mary treasured Jesus, so let us be wise and do the same! Jesus increased in every good way, so let us be wise and do the same!

Conclusion: And all God's people said: Amen!
