#### SECOND READING: Romans 3:19-28 NET

19 Now we know that whatever the Law says, it says to those who are under the Law, so that every mouth may become silent and the whole world may stand guilty before God.
20 Therefore, not one person will be justified before God by doing what the Law says, because the Law teaches us to recognize sin.

<sup>21</sup> But now God has shown a righteousness that comes from Him---<a righteousness> apart from the Law. The Law and the Prophets tell about it. <sup>22</sup> This righteousness comes from God to all who believe, just by their believing *[by having faith]* in Jesus Christ.

There is no difference, <sup>23</sup> for all have sinned and are without the praise that God gives. <sup>24</sup> They are justified *[declared righteous]* freely by His grace, through the ransom Christ Jesus paid. <sup>25</sup> God publicly displayed Him as the Atonement Cover through faith in His blood. <God did this> to show that He is just, even though in His patience He had left unpunished those sins which had been done in the past. <sup>26</sup> He wanted to show His justice at the present time, so that He might be righteous and the One who

justifies [acquits] the person who believes in Jesus.

<sup>27</sup> What then becomes of our pride? It is excluded. On what principle? On the principle of works? No, rather it is excluded on the principle of faith! <sup>28</sup> For we conclude that a person is justified *[declared righteous]* by faith-apart from the works of the Law.
