Bible Basis: Mark 1:29-39 ESV

Which Activity Is MOST Important?

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: We all have many options in our lives, so we *choose some* and *pass on others*; then, *seeing the options we have chosen*, we try to prioritize them from *most important to *least important. Therefore, let's apply those same skills to today's gospel reading.

Mark 1:29-39 includes these four activities: (1) healing the sick, (2) casting out demons, (3) praying, and (4) preaching. As we move through the text, identify which activity YOU THINK is most important!

- 1. Jesus Heals Peter's Mother-in-Law: As we harmonize the events in Matthew and Mark, we conclude that Jesus taught and cast out a demon in the synagogue in Capernaum on Saturday afternoon.
 - a. ²⁹ And immediately he left the synagogue and entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. // Simon (Peter) and Andrew were brothers and lived together in the same house in Capernaum, along with Simon's wife and his mother-in-law. Apparently Jesus had been invited, with James and John, for dinner.
 - b. 30 Now Simon's mother-in-law lay ill with a fever, and immediately they told him about her.

And he came and took her by the hand and lifted her up, and the fever left her, and she began to serve them. // It seems that Jesus was not told about the illness until he had entered the house; in other words, He went there to eat, not to heal. From Luke, the doctor, we are told that she had a high fever. Then Jesus took action — not as a doctor, by diagnosing and prescribing, but as the Son of God, by simply taking her hand and granting immediate healing! And how do we know she was healed? Because "she began to serve them."

2. Jesus Heals Many Sick and Demon-Possessed:

- a. ³² That evening at sundown [after the Sabbath, when the day of rest had come to an end] they brought to him all who were sick or oppressed by demons [demon-possessed not just troubled by demons, but controlled by demons]. ³³ And the whole city was gathered together at the door. // Lenski noted: "Since the Sabbath had passed, the work of bringing all these sufferers to Jesus could be performed without violating the law of Sabbath rest" (84). Also, Capernaum, at that time, "had a population of about 1,500" people, so it was QUITE A SCENE with "the whole city" being gathered at the door.
- b. ³⁴ And he healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons. And he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him. // Mark recorded that

Jesus healed and cast out "many"; did that include everyone? Yes! Matthew records that Jesus "healed all who were sick" (8:16), while Luke records that Jesus "laid his hands on every one of them and healed them" (4:40). Regarding the demons that Jesus expelled, it included "all those that came into his presence" (Lenski, 84).

3. Jesus Prays; Jesus Preaches:

- a. ³⁵ And rising very early in the morning, while it was still dark, he departed and went out to a desolate place, and there he prayed. // In other words, He talked with His Father in heaven. The Bible records that Jesus prayed on various important occasions; for example, "all night [Jesus] continued in prayer to God" (Luke 6:12) just before He chose His twelve apostles. Therefore, knowing that prayer is important and powerful, let us do so \$\daily\$ and \$\daily\$ as a FIRST RESORT in every time of decision and need!
- b. ³⁶ And Simon and those who were with him [probably Andrew, James, and John] searched [literally, pursued closely, hunted] for him, ³⁷ and they found him and said to him, "Everyone is looking for you." // Think about this series of events: The "whole city" had gathered at Peter's door and were richly blessed on Saturday evening; then, very early on Sunday morning, those same people returned FOR MORE more blessings, more of this great Jesus, the Son of God in human flesh! When Peter said, "Everyone is looking for you," he was implying to Jesus that

- the people wanted more from Him, so Jesus should immediately return to them! So now the dilemma, what to do? Jesus already knew the answer BECAUASE of His time in prayer!
- c. ³⁸ And he said to them, "Let us go on to the next [or neighboring] towns, that I may preach there also, for that is why I came out." ³⁹ And he went throughout all Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out demons. // So, without hesitation, Jesus laid out His plan: The people of Capernaum have heard my preaching and witnessed many miracles, now I must go to other towns to preach there! Then He did!

Conclusion: So which activity is MOST important – *healing*, *casting*, *praying*, *or preaching*?

- ★ When we are sick, healing is wonderful but the benefits are only for this temporal life.
- → For the demon-possessed, Jesus' casting out was so powerful – but it did not save their souls.
- → Praying is important and powerful, so we should pray often – but it does not save us or others.
- → Preaching is MOST important, so Jesus chose it over healing and casting — BECAUSE God is at work, by His Spirit through His Word, to make us sorry and give us faith, thus to save our souls and make us His very own!

<u>Let us pray</u>: Father in heaven, since life in this twenty-first century is so complicated, please \$\infty\$show us what is MOST important and \$\infty\$move us to make such things our priorities!
