## Genesis 1:1-31 NIV and Other Passages

## The Holy Trinity Created Us and Saved Us!

Sunday, June 15 at 9:00 + Monday, June 16 at 7 PM
The Holy Trinity / First Sunday after Pentecost - 2014

**Introduction**: Dear friends in Christ: Today, on the Sunday of the Holy Trinity, we remember that the One True God has revealed Himself to us in His Word as the Triune God, thus three Persons in one God!

In this sermon we will see that reality ◆in the Biblical creation account and ◆in God's work to save us from our sins!

- 1. The Holy Trinity Created Us: Sometimes it can be helpful to think of +the Father as the architect, +the Son as the general contractor, and +the Spirit as the building inspector.
  - a. Notice the Holy Trinity on Day 1:
    - i. Father and Son: In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." Many would identify "God" as "God the Father," but as we read that passage in light of the whole Bible we could say that the Father designed "the heavens and the earth" while the Son made them. In reference to the Son, the Bible says: "All things came into being through Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being." (John 1:3 NAU)

- ii. Holy Spirit: Mow the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters." So what was the Spirit doing? Dr. Kretzmann wrote that He was "making use of His divine power in causing the elements to combine in the form which they now have." (OT 1:2)
- iii. Son: "And God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light." The Bible tells us that the Son of God is the Word of God: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God [thus with God the Father], and the Word was God [thus the second Person of the Holy Trinity]." (John 1:1 NAS)
- b. On days 2-6a, the Son of God was at work –
  ◆sometimes to actually make something, ◆other times to simply call something into being:
  - i. Day 2: <sup>6</sup> And God said, "Let there be an expanse between the waters..." <sup>7</sup> So God made the expanse...
  - ii. Day 3: <sup>9</sup> And God said, "Let the water under the sky be gathered to one place, and let dry ground appear." And it was so.... <sup>11</sup> Then God said, "Let the land produce vegetation..." And it was so.
  - iii. Day 4: <sup>14</sup> And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the sky... <sup>16</sup> God made two great lights... He also made the stars.
  - iv. **Day 5:** <sup>20</sup> And God said, "**Let the water teem** with living creatures, **and let birds fly** above the earth..." <sup>21</sup> **So God created** the great creatures of the sea... and every winged bird...

- v. **Day 6a:** <sup>24</sup> And God said, "**Let the land produce** living creatures according to their kinds..." <sup>25</sup> **God made** the wild animals..., the livestock..., and all the creatures that move along the ground...
- c. Notice the Holy Trinity on Day 6b: Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, in our likeness..." So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. // "us" and "our" must be references to the Holy Trinity; also, God spoke of "our image" and "our likeness," which point to the Persons of the Holy Trinity having one image and one likeness.

  So the Holy Trinity created us!
- 2. The Holy Trinity Saved Us: But wait! Do we even need to be saved? Sure, some have done horrible things and they need to be saved, but aren't we good enough? Let's consider what the Bible says in Romans 3:10-20 about people having the ability to be good enough on their own >>> Romans 3:10-20...
  - a. The Father He Planned, Gave, and Raised:
    - i. Planned: Peter preached these words about Jesus: "This man was handed over to you by God's set purpose and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross." (Acts 2:23 NIV)
    - ii. **Gave**: "For <u>God so loved the world that He gave</u> His only begotten Son..." (John 3:16 NAS)
    - iii. **Raised**: People crucified Jesus, "But <u>God</u> raised him from the dead..." (Acts 2:24 NIV)

- b. The Son He Lived, Suffered, and Died:
  - i. Lived FOR US: Jesus said: "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets
    [OT]; I have not come to abolish them but to
    fulfill them." (Mat 5:17 ESV)
  - ii. **Suffered FOR US**: Jesus "bore our sins in His body on the cross..." (1Pe 2:24 NAS)
  - iii. **Died FOR US**: "...<u>Christ also died for sins</u> once for all, <u>the just for the unjust</u>, in order that He might bring us to God..." (1Pe 3:18 NAS)
- c. The Holy Spirit He Justifies, Guides, & Empowers:
  - i. Justifies: Paul wrote: "...you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God." (1Co 6:11 ESV)
  - ii. **Guides**: Jesus said: "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth..."

    (John 16:13 ESV)
  - iii. **Empowers**: "I pray that out of his [the Father's] glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being..." (Eph 3:16-17 NIV)

So the Holy Trinity has saved us; we are blessed!

**Conclusion**: Now, being ©alive in our bodies and ©saved in our souls, *let us thank and honor the Holy Trinity!* **Amen!**
