## Did Jesus Make Peter the First Pope?

Text: Matthew 16:13-20 NAS 1995

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: This sermon focuses on →Jesus, →His followers, and →God's gift of forgiveness!

 Setting: <sup>13</sup> Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi... // Jesus and His disciples were ♦25 miles north of the Sea of Galilee, ♦at the base of Mt. Hermon, and ♦near one of the largest springs feeding the Jordan River.

> At Caesarea Philippi, Jesus had an important conversion



with His disciples – people who \*trusted in Him,
\*followed Him, and \*learned from Him.

- 2. What Did OTHERS Say about JESUS? He was asking His disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" <sup>14</sup> And they said, "Some *say* John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; but still others, Jeremiah, or one of the prophets."
  - a. John ♥was prophesied, ♥baptized many, and
    ♥prepared people for the Christ, *but he was NOT the Christ*.
  - b. <u>Elijah</u>: Malachi (4:5) mentioned about the coming of Elijah; then Jesus clarified that *the Elijah-like prophet to come is John the Baptizer* (Mt. 11:14).
  - c. <u>Jeremiah, etc.</u>: Each person mentioned was a great servant of God, *but NONE were the Christ*.
- What Did JESUS' DISCIPLES Say about JESUS? <sup>15</sup> He said to them, "But who do you [ὑμεῖς plural] say that I am?"
  - a. <sup>16</sup> Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." // Peter gave a HUGE answer: You are ♦the One promised in Eden,
    ♦the focus of the OT Scriptures, ♦the Son of God in human flesh, ♦the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!
  - b. <sup>17</sup> And Jesus said to [Peter], "Blessed are you, Simon Barjona [son of Jonah], because flesh and blood did not reveal this to you, but My Father who is in heaven." // Many today are confused about Jesus' identity, but for us, just like Peter, God the Father has opened our eyes to the truth. So, let us \*give thanks and \*live for Jesus!

## 4. What Did JESUS Say to Peter?

 a. Jesus to Peter: <sup>18</sup> "I also say to you [σοι – singular] that you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build My church; and the gates of Hades will not overpower it. //


Did Jesus build His church on Peter? **No!** Notice how these words are similar BUT DIFFERENT:

Horizons O (Organic) A (Surface)

B (Subsoil)

C (Substratum)

R (Bedrock)





- i. <u>Peter</u> (Πέτρος – Petros): <u>Isolated</u> <u>stone</u>.
- ii. <u>Rock</u> (πέτρα Petra): <u>Bedrock</u>.
- b. Jesus to Peter: <sup>19</sup> "I will give you [σοι singular] the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever you bind on earth shall have been bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall have been loosed in heaven."
  - Did Jesus give the keys ONLY to Peter?
     When Jesus called Peter, "you" (σοι), it was singular. So, with the words above, Jesus gave the keys only to Peter.
  - ii. However, in Matthew 18:18, "you" is plural: Jesus said to His disciples who
     trusted in Him, +learned from Him, and
     followed Him: "Truly I say to you [ὑμῖν plural], whatever you bind on earth shall

have been bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall have been loosed in heaven." // In other words, the keys are given to all believers (all who trust in, learn from, and follow Jesus) – to  $\bullet$ lock heaven to the <u>unrepentant</u> but  $\bullet$ unlock heaven to the <u>repentant</u>. As the Bethlehem pastor, I use the keys in our Divine Services, but we can all use them in our daily lives.

- iii. <u>Peter was certainly a leader</u>: ▶when he preached to Jews on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2), ▶when believing Samaritans were sent to him (Acts 8), and ▶when Gentiles heard about Jesus through him (Acts 10).
- iv. <u>Peter was certainly a sinner</u>: ♦when Jesus called him Satan (Mt. 16), ♦when he denied knowing Jesus (Mt. 26), and ♦when Paul reprimanded him (Gal. 2).

**Conclusion:** <sup>20</sup> **Then [Jesus] warned the disciples that they should tell no one that He was the Christ.** // Even though Jesus came to save us from our sins, many thought the Christ would be a political leader, *like David*. So, it was best to keep His identity hidden until His death and resurrection.

**Let us focus on Jesus and the Bible**, not people and their sintainted ideas.

Let Us Pray: Dear Father, TYSM for <u>revealing</u> Jesus to us, <u>giving</u> us trust in Him, and <u>permitting</u> us to use the keys. Help us to \*encourage the repentant and \*call others to repent.
